AITP Sales Leadership & Development SIG Meeting - September 12, 2002 Meeting Summary and October 10th meeting CIO Roundtable

I want to personally thank all of those who attended yesterday's Sales Leadership & Development SIG meeting at the Metropolitan Club. The attendance was better than I had anticipated. However, it was a happy problem having to request additional chairs to be brought into the room. For all those who responded to me with interest in the meeting but were unable to attend, I do hope you will be able to join us for next month's meeting, Thursday, October 10, at the Metropolitan Club. Make checks out to Gerry Parran for \$25.00.

Rich Barnier, President of our local AITP chapter, was the Key Note speaker and presented "**Strategic Partnerships thru Professional and Personal Networking.**" His comments covered strategies and tactics on building, maintaining, and leveraging your professional / personal network. As part of Rich's presentation, he facilitated a group collaboration exercise which had the members of the SIG identify organizations they were trying to penetrate and linked them to other members who could provide contacts and / or introductions into those organizations. Needless to say, the value provided by this exercise alone well paid for the price of admission!!

Some of the strategies and tactics Rich has successfully employed to develop his network is to align our local chapter with the Executive Club of Chicago (Rich is also their Chair of the CEO/CIO focus group), providing our membership with access to the ECC's members and events. He has also taken this same approach with the National Association of Computer Consulting Businesses (NACCB), and the Society of Information Management (SIM). Some of the other ideas Rich shared with the group included: buying a few shares of stock in each company you are either doing business with or trying to penetrate. The benefit of this approach is that as a stockholder, it provides you with a large amount of information on those firms but can also be leveraged to contact people in those organizations with whom you may have not had access to previously. Although Rich shared many other thoughts, the one that he clearly emphasized is that people buy from people they already KNOW. If you can get to know people, your chances of selling to them increase dramatically.

Julia Goodwin approached me afterwards with a suggestion for the SIG to form LEADS groups. These are small groups composed of individuals representing firms that do not compete with each other for the purpose of sharing contact information, making introductions for one another, sharing best practices, etc. Each LEAD group would meet quite regularly, probably every other week. This is still in the planning phase so be watching for more information on this soon.

PLANS FOR THE OCTOBER 10th MEETING

The next meeting is being planned for Thursday, October 10, 2002, at the Metropolitan Club. I would like to continue to schedule these meetings for the second Thursday of each month. Rich Barnier will be the **facilitator for a roundtable discussion with several local CIOs. The theme of the roundtable will be "Evaluating Business Partners."** The objective of the roundtable will be to provide a "voice of the customer," to help us understand how we as sales professionals can increase our value to the IT community and to the organizations we represent. I anticipate at least some of the following topics to be covered:

How do you prefer being approached by sales people?

How much of your buying decision is based on relationship with the sales person vs. the sales person's knowledge,

What economic justifications are used when considering a purchase?

What due diligence do you conduct prior to making a decision (reference checks, check with industry analysts such as Gartner or MetaGroup, hire a consultant to do an evaluation, companies financial condition, etc.)

Due to the interest in this roundtable, attendance will be limited to provide for a more valuable and relaxed discussion. Therefore, I encourage you to place this event on your calendar now. Be watching for more information in the next couple of weeks with more details.

November's Meeting

Rather than a formal meeting, the November meeting will be the AITP CIO of the Year Awards which will be held at the Illinois Technology Showcase November 13 and 14 at Navy Pier. The Mayor and the Governor will open the showcase with their comments on the value of information technology. In addition, the AITP CIO of the Year award ceremony will be held November 14, 11:30 am, during the showcase. Recent award winners include John Moon, Baxter Healthcare and Jean Holley, USG. Positioning information systems development environments strategically – what direction will your company take to develop in the future?

Presenter John Nader will talk about the history and value proposition of Java and provide an overview of the J2XX strategic development environment (J2EE, J2SE, and J2ME). 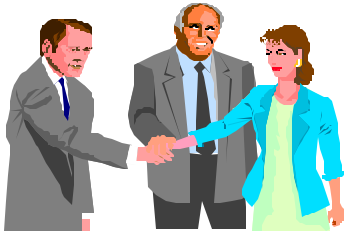

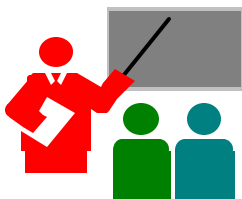

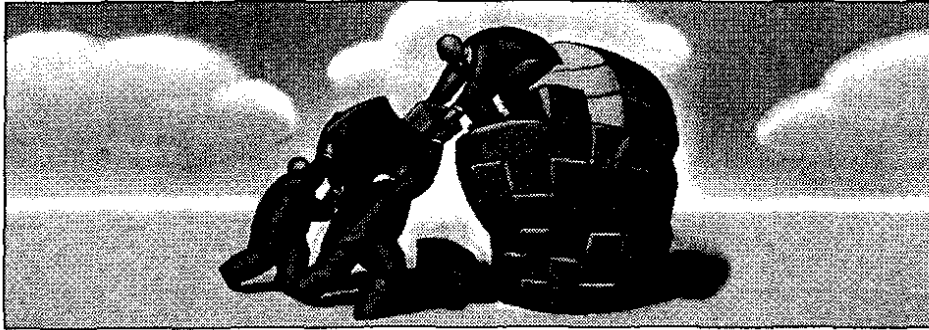
