Installing and maintaining server security has become a time critical and an around-the-clock job. The challenges facing server security management range from time critical virus detection updates to upgrading applications to process on supportable, defendable operating systems. In addition to challenges of managing the security components, there is also the funding hurdle to justify the cost of security. Plus there is the education aspect that can raise awareness of risky behavior and personal responsibility to make security everybody's business.

This SIG is open to those responsible for infrastructure in their companies (no vendors). It will provide an opportunity for key people to share their experiences with their peers and to help define best practices in infrastructure support.

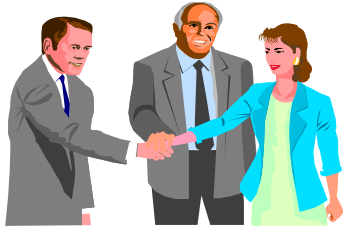
