DeVry University Scholarship Programs

* Dean's Scholarship HS students with an ACT score of 24 or higher must start DeVry within one year of graduation

* Presidential Scholarship- the top ten Dean's scholars compete for two of these full tuition scholarships after a competitive essay is graded

* Community Scholar Award- allows every HS in the state to award a \$1,000 scholarship to any student meeting our entrance criteria

* Community College Scholarship allows any CC grad with a 3.3 CGPA to receive a \$1,500 per term scholarship.

* Community College Community Scholarship allows each regionally accredited two-year college to award a \$1,000 scholarship to any of their graduates meeting our entrance criteria

* Cisco Scholarship grants a graduate of a HS or CC CISCO Academy program to receive 1 \$1,200.00 per term scholarship.

These students will also receive some course credit for the ECT, NSA and NCM programs.

* FIRST Scholarship awards a \$1,000 per term scholarship to students who competed in a regional FIRST Robotics competition.

* SkillsUSA VICA Scholarship awards a scholarship to HS seniors who place 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in selected competitions.

* Community College Scholar Award offers the opportunity for every regionally accredited two-year school to award one graduate a DeVry scholarship worth \$1,000.00 per term

Speakers: David Snyder is Associate Publisher of Crain's Chicago Business

David is in the No. 2 management position for the nation's leading local business newspaper. He was named to that post in September 2004.

Mr. Snyder had spent the previous four-and-a-half years as *Crain's* General Manager/Interactive where he launched and then managed the paper's online publishing unit, under the brand name ChicagoBusiness.com. ChicagoBusiness.com has become the nation's largest Web site affiliated with a local business newspaper with more than 140,000 registered users.

In 2005, ChicagoBusiness.com was named the nation's "Best Internet Business Service (under 1 million monthly visitors)" by Editor & Publisher and MediaWeek magazines.

A 21-year Crain veteran, Mr. Snyder made a rare career move from the editorial side of the newspaper to the business side.

He served for more than more than six years as the paper's editor (1993-2000). In that post, he supervised the staff of reporters, editors and graphics professionals who report, write and design each week's issue of *Crain's*. He also wrote a biweekly column on the paper's op-ed page.

Mr. Snyder has also served as managing editor, news editor and assistant news editor of the weekly business newspaper.

He joined *Crain's Chicago Business* in 1983 as a researcher in the Washington D.C. bureau. He moved to Chicago in 1984 and spent the next four years covering consumer products and food companies. His 1988 story on the strategic crisis at Sears, Roebuck and Co. won a Peter Lisagor Award from the Chicago Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists.

Mr. Snyder also won Lisagor awards in 1995 and 1997 for editorial writing. He also captured a Lisagor in 1997 in the category of sports commentary.

A native of Easton, Pa., Mr. Snyder is a graduate of American University in Washington, D.C., where he received his degree in business administration and was editor of the student newspaper.

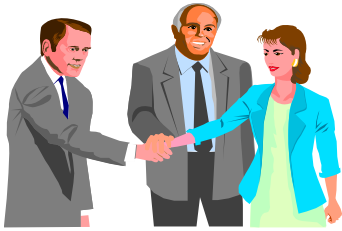
